ADJUTANT'S NOTES

The Post Executive Committee meeting held October 21, 2006 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from finance, clubroom and gambling.

A representative from our accounting firm KBP & Company was present to review the 3rd Quarter Financial Statement with the Executive Committee. No areas of concern were noted.

Adjutant mentioned he is required to file a report with the Department of Minnesota concerning any membership dues increase for the Legion year 2008. Discussion of this matter resulted due to the fact **The American Legion National dues will increase \$4.50 effective January 10, 2007 and Department and 10th District dues will increase another \$3.50 effective with the 2008 dues.**

The Executive Committee voted to increase the Post membership dues to \$35 effective January 1, 2007. It is imperative that unpaid members remit their 2007 dues before December 31, 2006 or payment of dues after that date will be \$10 more. If any member paid or unpaid are considering becoming a Paid-Up-For-Life member, now is the time since waiting until after the first of the year will cost well over \$100 more.

We have signed up a number of members in the PUFL program since the increase in dues was first announced. It is expected all American Legion Posts throughout the country will be raising their dues to about \$35 to offset those increases by national, departments and districts.

The Executive Committee reviewed all requests for donations and those approved were recommended for approval to the Post General Membership.

The Post General Membership meeting held November 7, 2006 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from Post officers and committee chairmen.

Adjutant reported Post member Norbert Tempel passed away since the last meeting.

Adjutant reported (729) members are signed up for 2007. We are currently (45) members ahead of one year ago. We are lacking the signing of new members into our Post and could use the help of all members in that area.

Post Commander Darrel Redepenning introduced Sons Of The American Legion 10th District Commander Wayne Mattingly from Osseo Post 172. Commander Mattingly spoke of the membership in the SAL and thanked The American Legion for the support given the SAL.

Richard Keith Sorenson Congressional Medal Of Honor Recipient

The last two Medal Of Honor recipients who were buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery were honored in a Veterans Day program the morning of November 11, 2006.

Lt. Richard Sorenson, U.S. Marine Corps, of Anoka and Lt. Donald Rudolph of Bovey now have their names inscribed on the Medal of Honor monument in the center of the cemetery and have a street in the cemetery named after them.

Rick Sorenson was planning to attend the 60th Anniversary of the Marshall Islands the end of October 2004 with his family, but passed away October 9, 2004 in Reno, Nevada. His ashes were flown back for a memorial service October 26, 2004 at Fort Snelling Chapel, followed by an Auxiliary lunch at the Post.

On Memorial Day, May 27, 1991, the bronze statue "Above and Beyond" by Rodger Brodin (commissioned and donated by Post 102) was unveiled at Veterans Memorial Park in Anoka. Rick was joined at that ceremony by Don Rudolph of Bovey.

2006 Boy Scout of the Year Award Jacob Johnson



On the 33rd Anniversary of honoring the Boy Scout of the Year from the Anoka area, Edward B. Cutter Post 102 recognized Jacob Johnson during the Veterans Day Dinner on November 11. Wayne Wallace introduced Jacob and his parents Randy and Marla Johnson. Jacob lives and goes to school in Coon Rapids, but is a member of Troop 518 sponsored by the Anoka Masons with meetings at the Masonic Lodge on 3rd and Monroe Street in Anoka. Jacob's dad Randy is the Scoutmaster for Troop 518.

Jacob started his scouting career when he was in 1st grade as a Tiger Cub and worked his way through Cub Scouts to earn the Arrow of Light and become a Boy Scout. He held leadership positions as assistant and senior patrol leader. He was also on the staff at Pinetree Scout Camp which is now known as Grey Wolf Camp; this camp teaches scouts how to become a senior patrol leader. Jacob has participated in community projects such as Scouting for Food, neighborhoods National Night Out and several food drives. He assists in putting grave flags out on veterans graves at Morningside Cemetery for Memorial Day; and has participated in a number of other Eagle Scout projects.

Jacob successfully completed his Eagle Board of Review on April 17, 2006 and had his Eagle Scout Court of Honor on October 29, 2006. Jacob states, "Scouting has taught me to be a true leader and how to voice my opinion should a conflict arise. All that I have learned from scouting, I know will help me in the future as an adult".

Jacob's Eagle Scout project was to replace the old playground boundary with new lumber; the old boundary was made up of old recycled plastic which was cracked and broken. This project was done at Delta Park in Coon Rapids and took about 80 hours to complete.

Jacob is currently in the National Honor Society at Coon Rapids High School; in his third year of wrestling, rugby for two years – he took 4th place in the State Tournament in those two years. He has been fully certified as an American Red Cross Lifeguard. While in the 10th grade, he was confirmed in his church, received three religious awards and is beginning his 4th and final religious award.

On behalf of Post 102, Jacob was presented The American Legion Medal of Merit with certificate and cash award.

If you knit or crochet - the lap robe sizes have changed. The new sizes are 25" X 25", 27" x 27" and 30" x 30". This is because they are needed for amputees in wheel chairs. Any larger are too big for our purposes.

If you have already made some larger, I will take them. If you want to do sewn lap robes the size is 3' X 5' made of all cotton washable material. One layer of outing flannel between 2 layers of cotton percale sheets or other cotton material. Washable afghans are allowed in nylon material also.

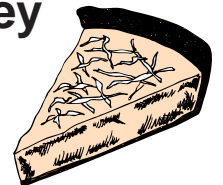
