Carroll was a tail gunner, 306 Bomber Group was killed over the English Channel. There is a tablet for him in the Cambridge American Cemetery, Cambridge England. Died 22 Oct. 1944 at 19 years old.

Floyd - US Army died in the Phillipines. He was 28 years old and is buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery. My younger brother is named after Lloyd.

Hello Legion Family,

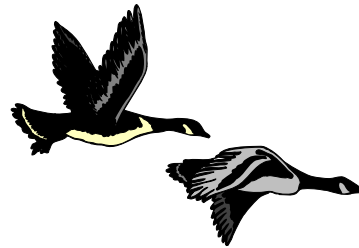

There was a resolution that stated senior members will be 18 & older. Early Bird Dinner will be the 14th of October.
