Guest Speaker Memorial Day Observance

Brigadier General Jon L. Trost



is the Assistant Adjutant General-Army, Minnesota National Guard. He is responsible for Congressional and Legislative Liaison for the Minnesota National Guard and serves as advisor to the Adjutant General on implementation of National Guard policies and programs. Additionally, he also has responsibility for all facilities within the National Guard.

Brigadier General Trost was born on August 10, 1950. A 1968 graduate of Appleton High School, he went on to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Arts Education from Moorhead State University, Moorhead, Minnesota.

His military education includes Artillery Officer Basic and Advance Courses, U.S. Command and General Staff College, and U.S. Army War College.

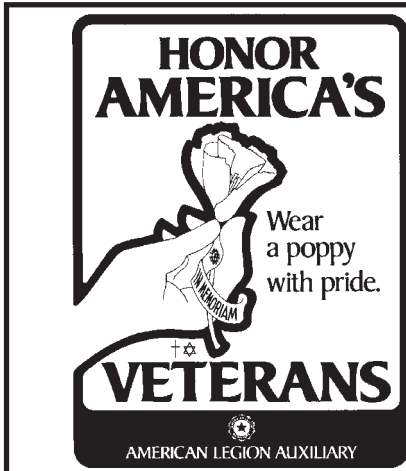
Brigadier General Trost began his career when he enlisted as an Infantryman in February 1970. He became a commissioned officer with the rank of 2nd Lieutenant June 1974 through the Minnesota Military Academy. His command experience includes Battery Executive Officer as 1st Lieutenant, Battery Commander as a Captain, several artillery battalion assignments as Major and Battalion Commander as a Lieutenant Colonel. He was then assigned

to the 34th Infantry Division Headquarters as Operations and Training Officer then back to the artillery as the 34th Division Artillery Commander and promoted to Colonel. His next assignment was 34th Infantry Division Chief of Staff. In January 2002, Brigadier General Trost was assigned the position of Assistant Division Commander – Operations for the 34th Infantry Division. He was promoted to Brigadier General in February 2002 and assumed his current duties as Assistant Adjutant General – Army in July 2004.

Brigadier General Trost's awards and decorations include: Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Army Reserve Components Overseas Training Ribbon, Minnesota Medal for Merit, Minnesota Commendation Ribbon, State Active Duty Ribbon, and Minnesota Service Ribbon.

Brigadier General Trost recently retired after more than 32 years as a teacher and Department Leader for Industrial Technology at Coon Rapids High School. He and his wife, Karin, live in Champlin, Minnesota. They have three children, Stephanie, Erik, and Brian.

Memorial Day observance will be held on Monday, May 30, 2005 at 10:00 am at the Anoka Veterans Memorial in John Ward Park.



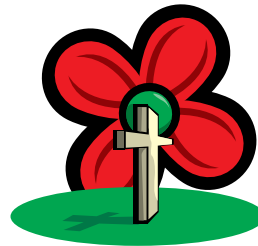

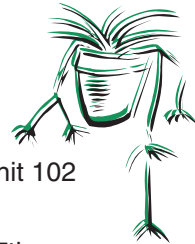

THE STORY OF THE FISHER HOUSE

Zachary Fisher, the son of a Russian immigrant, left high school at 16 to help his father and older brother in the family construction business. Unable to serve his country in WWII due to a severe knee injury in a construction accident, he assisted the US Army Corps of Engineers build coastal fortifications.

Mr. And Mrs. Fisher were always dedicated to the Armed Forces, those who serve and those who

have served. The Fisher Foundation is dedicated to enhancing the public perception of the US Military and to help members of the Armed Forces and veterans. In 1982, they established the Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher Armed Services Foundation (now called the Armed Forces Foundation) to provide financial assistance to members of the Armed Forces and their dependents; it has provided substantial direct payment to surviving families and it also provides college scholarships to active and former service members and their families.

In 1990, the Foundation decided to build a home designed to house families of patients undergoing treatment at US Military hospital installations. The comfort home project was well received and it evolved into the Fisher House Foundation, Inc., currently there are 32 Fisher Houses located throughout the United States and in Germany. (The Fisher House Foundation also administers the Military Children Program, the Hero Miles Program and the Newman's Own Awards.)

In 1996, the American Legion Auxiliary presented Zachary and Elizabeth with the Public Spirit Award for their dedication to veterans and their families.

Another major project of Zachary and Elizabeth was the purchase and restoration of the aircraft carrier Intrepid, which is now the Intrepid Sea Air Space Museum on the Hudson River in New York City; the world's largest naval museum.

Mr. Fisher passed away June 7, 1999 at the age of 88; his memorial service was aboard the Intrepid. From then Secretary of Defense William Cohen on Mr. Fisher's passing, "Zach Fisher was a true patriot, who believed in a strong defense and held American military servicemen and women in the highest regard. He honored us all with his pride in the US military and his generous support of those who defend our nation. Elizabeth passed away on January 13, 2004.

Among the many honors Mr. Fisher received included: Volunteer Action Award (1988) by President Ronald Reagan; Presidential Citizens Medal (1995) and the Presidential Medal of Freedom (1998) by President Bill Clinton.

The American Legion presented its highest honor, The Distinguished Service Award, posthumously, to Zachary Fisher at its 81st National Convention (1999) in Anaheim, California. Then National Commander Butch Miller said of Mr. Fisher, "what he accomplished in his lifetime will be forever remembered in history books and in lives touched. Every day of his life, in every way possible, Zachary Fisher gave back to the nation he loved."

Minneapolis Fisher House

The Minneapolis Fisher House is located on the VA campus at the corner of 54th Street and Minnehaha. It was designed to match the style of "Officers Row", once a part of Fort Snelling and has a common kitchen, laundry, dining and living rooms with 10 private bedrooms (some of which are handicapped accessible).

A Fisher House is a "home away from home" for veterans involved in treatment at the Medical Center, their family members and significant others eligible to stay at the house. It is a temporary residence and is not a treatment facility, hospice or counseling center. The guests at the house must be able to get back and forth to the Medical Center and be able to prepare their own meals, do their own laundry, etc., families are asked to care for the home as if it were their own.

It is for individuals requesting three nights of lodging or more and not for a single nights lodging. Many of the active duty patients cared for at the Medical Center who stay at Fisher House are receiving some type of rehabilitation that typically lasts six weeks or longer. The Rehab team, assisted by the Combat Stress Support Unit out of the 88th Regional Readiness Command, developed a program where active duty uniformed personnel visit the active duty veterans.

Services provided by Fisher House include: transportation arrangements, informational meetings given by staff and the American Legion auxiliaries. Groceries have been provided for families without funds and for house dinners; the Fisher Foundation has given a generous supply of prepaid telephone calling cards which are distributed to the families.

The house continues to have close to a 100% monthly occupancy rate and is greatly appreciated by the family members, active duty personnel and veteran patients who stay there.

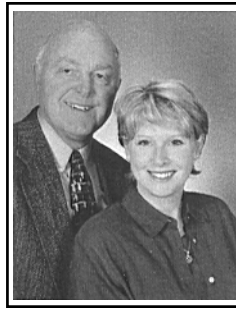
Donations help pay for new Fisher Houses and fund special projects to improve quality of life for house guests. Anoka Auxiliary Unit 102 has the Fisher House in their yearly budget and holds an annual VA Shower in February and March of every year. Items from this shower are donated to the Mpls. & St. Cloud VA Hospitals and to the Minneapolis Fisher House.

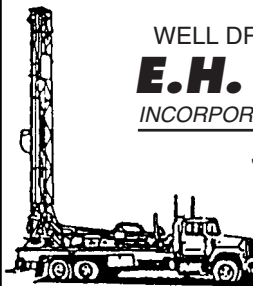
