ADJUTANT'S NOTES

The Post Executive Committee meeting held November 28, 2006 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from finance, clubroom and gambling.

The House and Entertainment Committee recommended to the Executive Committee the need for new 8 foot dining tables. Club Manager Lannie Vaughn also mentioned the need for updated refrigeration equipment. The Executive Committee approved the purchase of additional tables and a refrigerator/freezer.

The 2007 proposed Post Budget was reviewed by the Executive Committee. After each area was reviewed, it was motioned to recommend approval of the 2007 proposed Post budget to the Post General Membership for their approval and adoption.

The Executive Committee reviewed all requests for donations and those approved were recommended for approval to the Post General Membership.

The Post General Membership meeting held December 5, 2006 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from Post officers and committee chairmen.

Tery Blahut, Scoutmaster of our Post sponsored Boy Scout Troop 631 and Mr. Scott Rollings, Assistant Scoutmaster from Zion Lutheran Church Boy Scout Troop, were present at the Post General Membership meeting. Tery mentioned due to the lack of boys for the scout troop it may have to disband and turn in their charter. The only other possibility is to merge our scout troop with the troop from Zion Lutheran Church who seem to be receptive to the idea. Details of such a merger have to be discussed.

The 2007 proposed Post Budget was presented to the Post General Membership by Budget Committee member, Bud Redepenning. Each area of the budget was reviewed with little discussion. The 2007 Post Budget was approved by the Post General Membership.

Adjutant reported Post members Floyd Strube, Roland Newman and Kirk Kingren had passed away since the last meeting.



First Vice Commander Gary Munkholm reported (770) members are signed up for 2007. We are currently (70) members ahead of one year ago. If you are still an unpaid member for 2007, please remit your dues prior to December 31, 2006. Membership dues increase \$10 in January 2007. In addition, your 2006 member card expires as of December 31, 2006.

Joan Carol Lauck

Joni, a 25 year Auxiliary member, was born in Yankton, South Dakota on October 14, 1936. She passed away November 30, 2006 at home.

Joni was adopted as a baby by Jerome and Margaret Schleier, she grew up in St. James, Minnesota with her also adopted sister Judy, who was 3 years younger – the two of them had quite an adventurous childhood. Fourteen years after Joni, the Schleiers had a boy, their brother Jay. Joni always said her birth mother was named Zeta and was a gypsy princess.

In 1953, Joni married Marv Englin, had 4 children, Scot, Kevin, Lori and Todd and moved to Anoka. Marv died in 1963 from a drowning accident. Joni and her young family moved to Coon Rapids, and while working as a secretary for the School District, met then married Chuck Lauck in 1971. Chuck was killed in an auto accident in 1981, Joni was seriously injured.

Joni joined the Auxiliary in 1982; she was Spring & Fall Luncheon Chairman and always worked and brought food for it; she was Children & Youth Chairman and Co-chairman; helped with funeral lunches and many other Unit projects.

Joni also joined the Drill Squad in 1982 until 1987, marching in all parades and competitions, traveling to Chicago, Seattle, New Orleans, Cincinnati, San Antonio and never missed Memorial Day with the group. Joni especially liked Halloween, dressing in costume and being out and about. She always had fun marching and made sure the group had fun too – you never knew what she would come up with next – and, she never got one blister, ever – while everyone else wore many band aids!

Joni moved to Anoka (again) 12 years ago and very much enjoyed decorating her house for every holiday and season – if you didn't know what time of year was getting close – you knew it after visiting her. She also enjoyed playing pull tabs and shopping with daughter Lori.

Cancer attacked Joni almost 8 years ago; she recovered and went 6 years and 1 day before it returned with a vengeance. Father Riser, retired from Epiphany Church, spoke very highly of Joni, especially when he said you really know who a person is by the pain and suffering they are given in their lifetime.

Caroline grew up in Iowa and knew who Elroy was, but avoided him by always crossing the street. His friends dared him to ask Caroline for a date, he did – she accepted and they were married for 51 years. They raised eight children and while they were living in Iowa, Caroline was President of the Titonka, Iowa HS PTA.

After moving to Anoka and both joining the Post and Unit (Elroy was a WWII vet in the Navy Seabees serving in Australia and the Pacific), they enjoyed all the people and friends at the Post; and as with most of the members during the Salad Luncheon era, Caroline donated food and time. She was also Past President of the Knights of Columbus Women' Auxiliary and Past President of St. Stephens School PTA.

With 12 brothers and sisters on Elroy's side and 13 in her family, visits back to Iowa were often for the Hatten family.

During the daytime, "All My Children" and "One Life To Live" had her attention. Caroline was an avid Minnesota sports fan; going to Vikings games at the Met, but she especially loved attending the Twins games also at the Met. Another adventure was going to Las Vegas with friends – but with a twist – they never had hotel reservations, they just gambled the whole time.
