The Post Executive Committee meeting held April 25, 2006 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from finance, clubroom and gambling.

Remembering Bertha

Unit members first met Bertha about 10 years ago when she was riding the Auxiliary casino bus once a month. Picked up at her apartment where she lived by herself – next door to her sister Shirley, Bertha would share her homemade cookies and candy on special occasions with everyone on the bus.

Bertha was perfectly capable of getting around at the casino's in her walker, which she would sometimes "lose" while playing the machines. Her only "gripe" while there was that you had to watch out for "those old people tripping you with their canes and wheelchairs".

She lost an infant daughter with her first husband, married Edward Rodby in 1942; worked at Federal Cartridge before WWII then transferred to the TC Army Ammunition Plant. Active in the First Congregational Church, Bertha enjoyed sewing, crafts, gardening and cooking. According to her niece, she could go hunting or fishing with her husband, cook a nice dinner, then get dolled up and go out dancing.

Bertha Moline Rodby was born to Matilda Knibbe and William Moline on March 12, 1903 in Anoka and passed away April 15, 2006 – 103 years young!

Minneapolis Junior Rifle Club

Part of the Minneapolis Junior rifle Clubs 2005/2006 season, sponsored by the American Legion Post 102.

On April 2, 2006 the American Legion State sporter and precision individual and team air rifle matches were held in Grand Rapids Minnesota. The Legion National Matches will be held in Bolin Green, Kentucky this summer.

MJRC fielded four sporter shooters and one team, two men and two women, of which one Bronze intermediate junior Medal, women; one Gold sub junior Medal, men; and a Silver team Medal were won. The precision portion, fielded five shooters and one team, four men and one woman, of which one Gold junior Metal, men; one Silver intermediate Metal, men; one Silver sub junior Metal, men and a Gold team Metal were won.

On April 20/22 the Minnesota State Junior Olympic 3-position Championship sporter and precision matches were held. MJRC fielded seven sporter shooters and one team, two men and five women, of which a women's 1st place, a women's 2nd place and a women's 3rd place were secured, along with a Silver Metal for team. The precision portion fielded five shooters and one team, four men and one women, of which a Men's 1st place and over all winner, a Men's 2nd place, a men's 3rd place and a Silver team Metal were won. MJRC ended up ten points behind the 1st place team in precision.

All of the Juniors are in 12th grade or younger, 10 to 18 years old. With many thanks for sponsorship provided by Legion Post 102, with their help, guidance and support these young shooters have had the opportunity to be able to learn and excel in a wonderful and demanding sport. Again thank you from the Minneapolis Junior rifle Club for all of your support.
