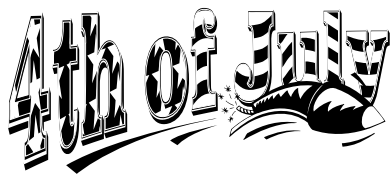

End of an Era Willard Castle Memorial Field

...Fall 1948... The Legion purchased Jacobson farm of approx. 15 acres (between Oakwood Cemetery and Fair oak Ave.). Over 100 recently discharged members dug a hole, built a foundation, pulled two hauled to the site, attached them, built a porch and accomplished all the wiring, plumbing and interior carpenter work.

...1949... A group of Anoka businessmen formed the Anoka Recreation Inc. with the intention of building a lighted baseball field. There was agreement between the City of Anoka, Anoka Recreation Inc., and the Legion to use a portion of the Legions' land for a lighted baseball field.

...June 25th, 1950... The first game was played on the lighted field.

...July 26th, 1950... The field was dedicated. Charlie Sell remembers the only name he heard was Greenhaven; he also pitched for Nowthen that night and got beat by Anoka 7 - 3.

...1950... Marv Gilbertson and Willard Castle put the first TV antenna up "on the hill" clubrooms.

...1951... Anoka Rec. was unable to come up with enough money to pay off the lights, so they approached Charles Horn of Federal Cartridge Corp. and he made up the \$12,500 deficit.

...Aug.18th, 1952... The field was given the name of Castle Field.

...Sept. 7th, 1953... Mayor Carl Bonnell and the Anoka American Legion re-dedicated the field to be known as Willard Castle Memorial Field.

Willard and Willis Castle were twin brothers who served in the U.S. Marine Corps during WWII. Willard (Butch) and Willis were active, dedicated Post 102 members who also played for Anoka in Town Team Baseball (dad Rolland was Post Commander in 1944-45).

Willard was well liked by all who knew him and was one of Anoka's finest basketball players and he had also done a lot of work on the new Legion Club room just across the street from the ball park.

While working on a power line Willard, an employee of the City of Anoka Water & Light Dept., was electrocuted on June 16th, 1952 - he was 26 years old.

Be a part of the 63 year history - watch the last remaining games played on this memorial field.

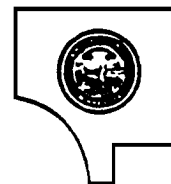

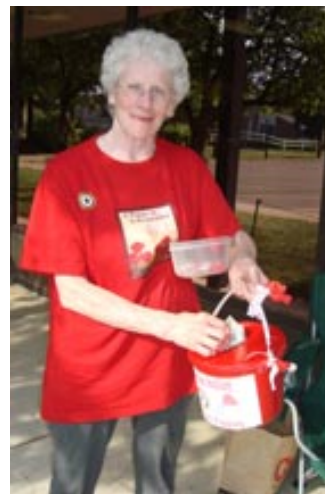
