#### **Stand Down**

Cathy Newman and myself volunteered at the annual Stand Down held at the Boy Scout Base Camp at Ft. Snelling on August 1st. This is the 3rd year that we have volunteered. Usually we help with the serving of a meal. This year we helped get corn ready for the huge grill and serving of the evening meal. For each meal there is a catering service or Veteran's group that furnishes the meal for all the veterans and volunteers.

Stand Downs are one part of the Department of Veterans Affairs' efforts to provide services to homeless veterans. Stand Downs are typically one to three day events providing services to homeless Veterans such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings, VA and Social Security benefits counseling, and referrals to a variety of other necessary services, such as housing, employment and substance abuse treatment. Stand Downs are collaborative events, coordinated between local VAs, other government agencies, and community agencies who serve the homeless. This one is under the supervision of MACV (Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans).

The first Stand Down was organized in 1988 by a group of Vietnam Veterans in San Diego. Since then, Stand Downs have been used as an effective tool in reaching out to homeless Veterans, reaching more than 200,000 Veterans and their family members between 1994-2000.

The idea is to bring many services to one location and make them more accessible to ALL veterans who otherwise may not seek out services or take advantage of benefits due to them. The Minnesota Stand Downs are held at Bemidji, Grand Rapids, International Falls, Rochester, Duluth and Mankato beside the biggest one in the Twin Cities.

This has been a truly rewarding volunteer position for the past 3 years in spite of it usually being one of the hottest days of the summer!
