ADJUTANT'S NOTES

The Post Executive Committee meeting held February 26, 2008 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from finance, clubroom and gambling.

The Executive Committee acted on the Annual Post Data Report which concerns the amount of membership dues for 2009 and the location where the dues are to be sent. The committee voted to keep the membership dues for 2009 at \$35 and the dues be sent to the Post 102 address.

The Executive Committee was visited by an insurance agent from a local insurance agency. His presence was to give an overview concerning the Board of Directors insurance. A member of the Executive Committee will meet with this insurance agent, prior to the next meeting, to discuss the possibility of better rates for other insurance carried by Post 102 and report back to the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee reviewed all requests for donations and those approved were recommended for approval to the Post General Membership.

Adjutant reported Post members Stanley Morton and Kenneth Hostetler had passed away since the last meeting.

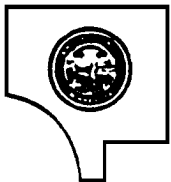

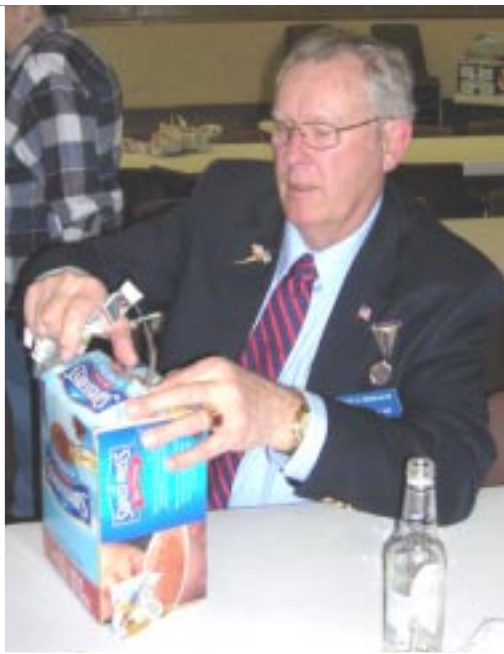

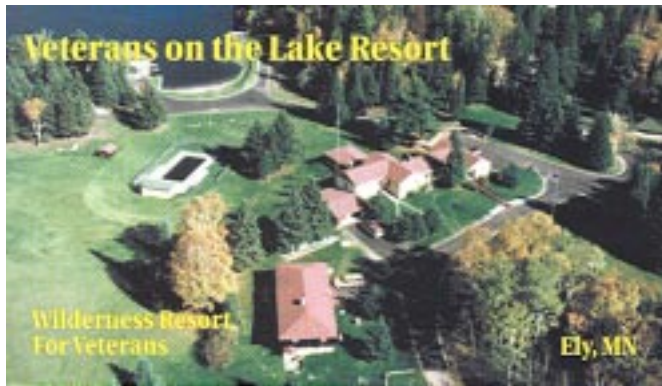
