Vietnam: The Veterans Experience

This 2 year project of the Anoka County Historical Society opened May 17th and is expected to be open 18-24 months.

The exhibit makes no political statement about U.S. involvement – it simply chronicles what people from Anoka County did during this time; the life for the soldiers in Vietnam, their service and the struggles both during and after their tours of duty.

Major exhibit settings include a supply base building, jungle, grass hut, 1960's living room scene and convoy scene. Each

area is interpreted for visitors with much of the information drawn from oral history interviews with veterans; interactive components in the exhibit allow visitors to share in some of the veterans' experiences.

The Vietnam exhibit admission is \$3 adults, \$2 students 6-17 years, ACHS members free. The History Center & Library at 2135 3rd Ave. N. in Anoka is open Tuesday 10 am – 8 pm, Wednesday thru Friday 10 am – 5 pm, and Saturday 10 am – 4 pm.

Auxiliary Raises Dues

Unit 102 had no choice but to raise senior dues from \$15 to \$20 for the 2006 membership year. Junior dues of \$3.50 will remain the same. Notice of this dues raise was announced at the October Ealy Bird Dinner; voted and approved at the January meeting and reported in Sandy's Scribbles.

For the 2005 year, \$13 of the \$15 Unit dues were paid out; \$5 to National, \$7 to Department and \$1 to District – also, all of the \$3.50 junior dues is paid out.

Our dues have not been raised for 11 years since the 1995 membership year when they went from \$12 to \$15; going back a few years:

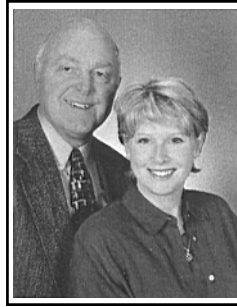
