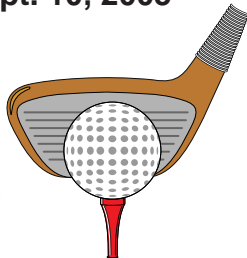

**NEWSPAPER CUTBACKS**

Our Anoka home Post (just like our own homes) from time to time is in need of urgent repairs. We certainly seem to have had our share of them in the past year or two. Everything from air conditioners, new ovens, new coolers, fire suppression system, security systems, parking lot...just to name a few. These unfortunately are all expensive projects and a big hit on our reserved funds. The Executive Committee is optimistic that we can rebuild these funds in time, but we were forced to make some difficult decisions in order to cut costs.

One of those cuts was to scale back the newspaper from monthly to every other month. This was not an easy decision! Our newspaper is excellent and consistently receives recognition from all levels of The American Legion. But the costs of publication and postage averages about \$1,000 per month, so scaling that back does represent a significant savings.

I know many of you may be distraught by this decision and there are a few voluntary things we can consider to potentially reverse this action:

1. If you no longer read the newspaper, because of our new website [www.anokalegion.org](http://www.anokalegion.org) which will be updated more often, or for whatever reason, please call or write the Post and have your name removed from the mailing list.
2. Would you be willing to pay a minimal subscription fee of around \$10 per year to continue monthly publication?
